

Charlotte Mason Society Center **Frequently Asked Questions**

What is the Charlotte Mason Society Center?

The Charlotte Mason Society Center is a facility for children to gather together and learn in a safe, loving family environment. CMS is based on the educational principles of British Educator, Charlotte Mason. CMS began in January 2001 by Charlotte Mason educator CarrieLee Farris.

How do you get your money?

CMS is supported completely by it's members and friends. We are not a nonprofit organization neither are we a not-for-profit organization. CMS is a private entity which is "owned" by CarrieLee Farris and governed by parents with the desire to provide a high quality learning environment using a biblical-based curriculum. It is important that parents pay tuition and material fees promptly to ensure financial success of the program.

Can my child bring a guest, relative or friend to class?

Due to liability, we cannot allow students to bring friends that are not enrolled to classes.

Can my child bring a scooter, bike, roller blades or skateboard to class?

Our goal is to provide a liberal education based on core subjects and incorporating the fine arts.

We do not have the area outside for these activities and safety is our highest priority. Children are to remain inside the building or in the nearby areas.

Who buys the food for snacks?

A list will be provided for all parents to sign up to bring some of the most used "staples" for snack-time. Snacks are provided that will correlate with the lesson and reinforce learning. Parents need to provide special snacks for children with food allergies.

What do I do if I have to go to work and my child is ill? Unfortunately, we are not equipped with a sick room or a nurse. Any child with the sniffles, a cough or runny nose, or watery eyes, will be sent home. It is not fair to ask us to become ill and infect the other students.

Do I get a refund/deduction on my bill if my child misses classes due to being ill?

No. We have to hire a teacher regardless if your child/ren are in class. The teachers plan their lessons and are paid whether or not your child is in class.
